Position Overview

Sapphire Coast Anglican College is a P-12, independent, Anglican College and is a Christ-centred, student focused and community minded school that develops extraordinary learners with a passion to serve others. Established in 1994, the College is located on the Far South Coast of NSW in the heart of the Bega Valley with an enrolment of approximately 360 students.

The college is known for its strong sense of community and pastoral care of students and their families and staff. Sapphire Coast Anglican College has strong links with St John's Anglican Church in Bega and local churches throughout the Bega Valley.

Sapphire Coast Anglican College is seeking a Chaplain to lead the Christian life of the College, teach Christian Education lessons and also to be a NESA Accredited Teacher and teach another subject as well (area subject to skills and abilities).

The Chaplain is a member of the Colleges' leadership team and is chiefly responsible for the gospel ministry of the college in line with the Canberra and Goulburn Anglican Diocesan Ethos Statement. The Chaplain will be a strong Christian who has a passion for the gospel, a heart for mission and ministry and is a passionate educator/community builder. The appointed applicant would possibly be an ordained minister or at least hold theological/Christian Education qualifications. On appointment the Chaplain would be licensed through the Anglican Canberra/Goulburn Diocese and would be supported through a range of Chaplain networks including the Anglican Schools Australia and the Canberra/Goulburn diocese.

Key Responsibilities

- Coordinate worship services and activities (such as staff devotions) including chapel services and special events;
- Strategically plan, develop and implement, with the College Executive, gospel opportunities and events;
- Assist with wellbeing throughout the college, providing support and advice to staff as appropriate;
- Assist with wellbeing for the broader school community including staff, students and parents;
- Assist with professional development and growth opportunities for staff;
- Lead the Christian Education program, providing support for teachers implementing the program and or teaching or co-teaching the program.
- Look for ways of fostering and building community for the purposes of the gospel;
- Contribute, foster and build the connection between the College and St John's Anglican Church;
- Hold a qualification in Theology or Christian Education as well as a NESA Accredited Teaching Qualification (teaching area negotiable)
- A strong awareness of the NSW curriculum and assessment requirements
- Work with the executive to critique new ideas and perspectives from a Biblical worldview.

Additional Requirements

- Willingness and enthusiasm to participate in co-curricular activities, camps and excursions;
- Perform other duties as required by the Principal / Deputy Principal
